MINUTES

PRESENT: Cllrs Colin Price (Chairman), John Dawson (Vice-Chairman), Ann Sheridan, Gerald Kay, Paul Bratt, Diane Elphinstone,

IN ATTENDANCE: Nigel Harrison (Parish Clerk & Responsible Financial Officer), Cllr Carl Lis and nine members of the public.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION: No matters were raised by members of the public that were not elsewhere covered on the agenda

- **1. Apologies for Absence:** None
- 2. Code of Conduct and Disclosable Pecuniary Interests
- **a.** No disclosable pecuniary interests or other interests were recorded in relation to items on the agenda
- **b.** No requests were made for DPI dispensations in connection with items on the Agenda.
- **Police Report:** A written report was received from the police which gave details of twenty five incidents that had occurred in the Parish between the 29th of July and the 21st of September, 2020
- 4. Highways and Street Lighting, Road Signage and Boundary Markers
- a. Requests for action
- (i) The Council noted that a complaint of obstructive parking near to the gates of Ingleborough Hall had been dealt with by the provision of no parking cones.
- (ii) It was further noted that a reported blocked culvert on Old Road, Clapham had been brought to the attention of NYCC

b. Updates and further actions on outstanding issues

The Council noted that faded road markings at Lawsings Brow/Wenning Bank; a pothole in Newby; road subsidence at Black Hill, Keasden and undercutting of the road on Reeby's Lane had been drawn to the attention of NYCC. It further noted that ten additional no parking cones had been purchased, five of which had been deployed to deal with problems near to the gates of Ingleborough Hall.

5. Minutes of the previous meeting

The Council **RESOLVED** that the Minutes for the Meeting of Clapham cum Newby Parish Council held on 28th of July, 2020 should be approved and signed by Cllr Price (Chairman) as a true and accurate record.

- 6. On-going issues
- **6.1** Parish Maintenance Matters
- a. To consider work for allocation to an independedent contractor.
- (i) It was noted that a ramp had been constructed at the A65 underpass, Station Road Clapham $\,$
- (ii) Guttering work on Reebys Lane was identified as required and it was agreed that Cllr Price would seek a quote for the work from R. Close

b. Works funded by the Forest of Bowland AONB grant.

(i) The Council was informed that Cllr Price has had some preliminary discussions with Mr E. Lorimer of the AONB about the stepping stones over the River Wenning

6.2 Community emergency plan, community defibrillator training and other topics related to the emergency services

Cllr Elhinstone informed the Council that she has received the form to order the defibrillator for Newby Chapel and has spoken to Harrison & Cross to engage their services for its installation. Further she has prepared a note for two parishioners in Newby who it is hoped will be involved with maintenance and monitoring of the device. She awaits a link to an online training course which might suffice for some. Face to face training will however be required for others without previous experience.

6.3 Neighbourhood Planning.

Cllr Sheridan informed the Council that policies are currently being reviewed . It is hoped that the consultation process can take place some time after Christmas. Progress will depend on the Covid-19 situation.

7. Clapham Playpark

The Council was made aware of work carried out both in maintenance of the park and in fund raising and expressed its gratitude on behalf of the parish. It was **RESOLVED** that the clerk should send a letter of thanks to the Park Association on behalf of the Parish Council

8. Possible Works on The Green, Clapham

The Council was made aware of plans to create a wild flower meadow on The Green. It was broadly supportive but

concerned that any such work be carried out in accordance with proper procedure and that the meadow should be properly maintained. An officer of the AONB was identified as a potential source of sound advice and Cllr Price undertook to attempt to put her in contact with the Ingleborough Estate.
